- **Provides light at night.**



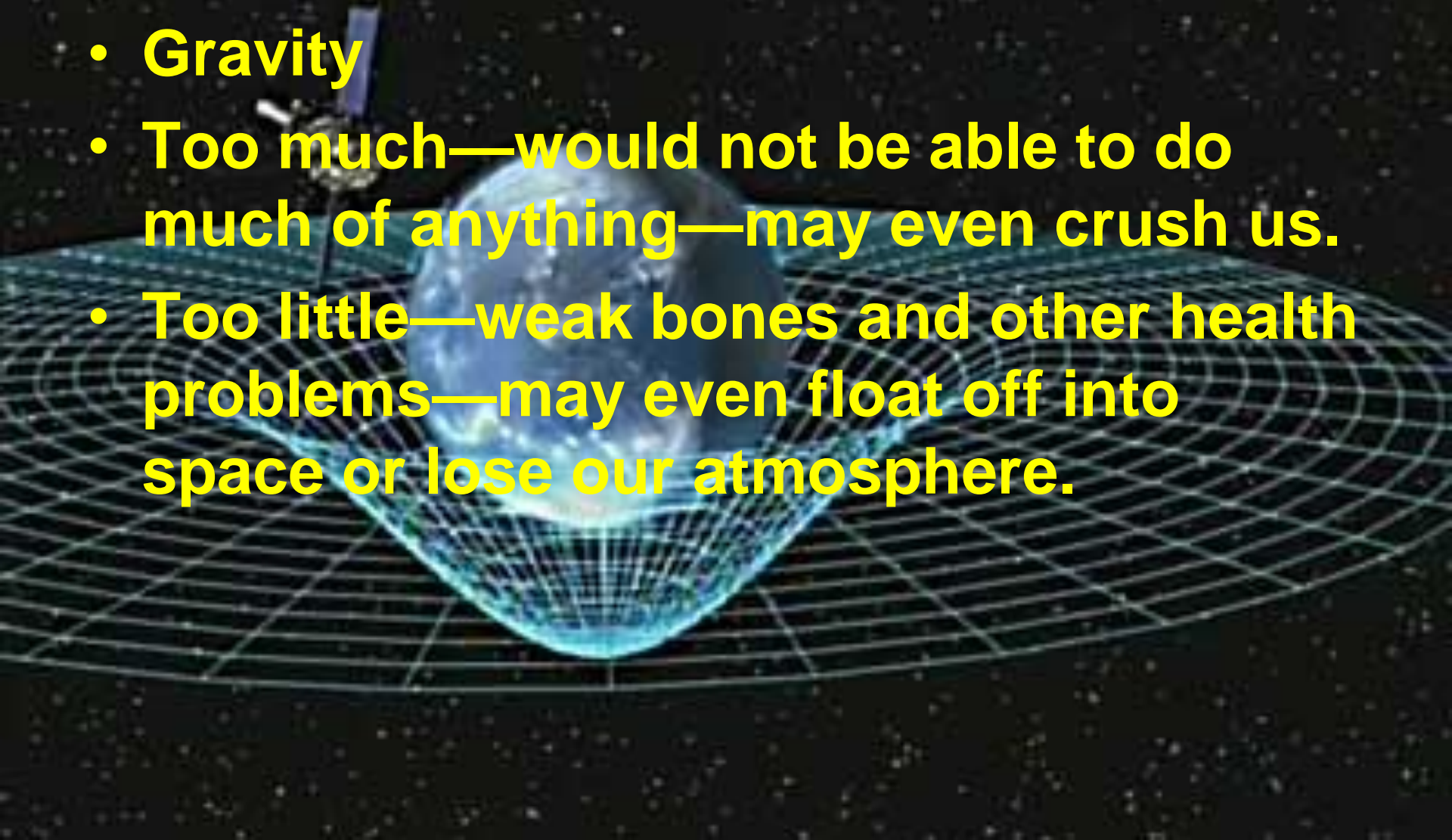


**God created the Earth just right.**

- **Too close to the center would kill all life.**


